13	<p>I would like to find out, would it be possible to get a scholarship for short term programs such as language courses.</p> <p>I would like to study medicine in Germany but because my A Level results come out after the application deadline I have to wait for a year. During this one year I would like to do a language course in German. What are the conditions be for me? Is it possible to get a scholarship at all?</p> <p>If I was able to get a scholarship would I be able to apply for scholarships that are for one academic year?</p>	<p>If you are currently a final year high school student you cannot apply for a short term programme. Short term programmes are for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Professionals*, academics/researchers <u>living and working</u> in northern part of Cyprus. • Postgraduate students enrolled in a university/higher education institution located <u>in northern part of Cyprus or in a NON EU country</u> at the time of application. • Recent PhD graduates (graduates of 2015/16, 2016/17 or 2017/18 academic year) of universities <u>located in northern part of Cyprus or in a NON EU country.</u> <p>• However, final year high school students can make an application for PD/UG 2: PD/UG-2 is for foundation/preparatory year or a language course.</p> <p>PD UG 2 Is for Final year high school/vocational school students studying at any high school located in Cyprus and expecting to graduate in 2018/19 academic year and/or Graduates of any high/vocational school located in Cyprus.</p> <p>You can study Foundation OR a language course in Germany for one academic year. Please read the guidelines for further details for PD/UG2 .</p>
14	<p>I am currently studying engineering in EU as a master student and currently I am at 1st year, 2nd semester of my master degree. Previous year I applied to EU scholarship for Turkish Cypriots and I was interviewed but didn't get the scholarship.</p> <p>My question is can I still apply for the scholarship?</p>	<p>Who can apply for PG-EU?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Final year undergraduate students enrolled in a university/higher education institution located in any EU member state and <u>expecting to graduate by the end of July 2019 at the latest.</u> • University graduates i.e. undergraduates or postgraduates of universities located <u>in any EU member state.</u> <p>If you are currently enrolled in a master's programme in an EU Member State and not expecting to graduate in 2018/19 academic year, the guideline clearly states that "Those who have already started their postgraduate programme in an EU country and <u>are not</u> expecting to graduate in 2018/19 academic year, i.e. currently in year 1 of a 2 year Master programme or in year 1 or 2 of a 3 year PhD programme in 2018/19 academic year in an EU country cannot apply."</p>

<p>15</p>	<p>I'm one of the candidates who will participate in the scholarship examination. I realized while checking the guide that the examination consists of only motivation letter and vnvs test. I want to learn if APTIS is no longer a part of the examination so that I can get prepared accordingly.</p>	<p>Yes, this year there will only be 1 VNVS Test (General Ability) and Motivation Letter. There will be no language test or interviews this year.</p> <p>Please click here for sample tests in both English and Turkish.</p>
<p>16</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is it enough to submit only the 7 years full-time education official document just for high school and secondary school(7 years) or is it better to submit all the primary, secondary and high school one by one (14 year's total)?Should I present it from the beginning of primary school? • Also,is it enough to present only the document you published in the website or should we add additional school certificates that proofs our education in Cyprus? • Additionally,can we add some kind of Europass CV or language certificates/international exam results to our application? • Lastly,I would like to ask you about the tuition fee process for 2019 2020 programme.For instance,the eligible scholars for the 2019 2020,scholarship programme grants maximum to 10 000 € worth tuition fee for 1 year(2 semester) and the scholars can cover the rest ? Thank you for your time. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You are asked on the application form to list all your education and this does include elementary and primary school, however you will need to submit official documentation proving 7 years education only. This official documentation can be from primary, secondary and/or high school in Cyprus. • Applicants are asked to prove only 7 years of education. Please see Annex 4 of our guidelines for required documents. • Please see Annex 4 of our guidelines for the required documents. There is no need to add extra documents. • There is a cap on the tuition fee to be paid to the host universities/institutions. The maximum amount of tuition fee that can be paid for one academic year programme is €10,000. If the tuition fee is more than €10,000, the scholar will be responsible to pay for the remaining amount. In the case of short term programmes the maximum amount of tuition fee will be calculated on pro-rata basis. <i>Please see table 1 on page 4 of the Guidelines.</i>The EU scholarship covers only one academic year of study and if the scholar's study programme is longer than one academic year, then the scholar hhas to cover the rest of the tuition fee.
<p>17</p>	<p>I would like to apply for this scholarship but on your websites it says "Students studying at a foundation / prep year in an EU member state at the time of application cannot apply for PD/UG Studies scholarship". I am currently studying Biosciences Foundation in The University of Manchester so i was wondering which category i need to apply to.</p>	<p>As stated on page 7 of our guidelines;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • students currently studying at a foundation / prep year <u>in an EU member state</u> at the time of application <u>cannot</u> apply for a scholarship. • Students who have already started their undergraduate studies at a university in an EU member state and <u>are not expecting to graduate in 2018/19 academic year</u> are not eligible to apply.
